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Notes about visiting the Whangarei Native Bird Recovery Centre

- Your visit will comprise of 2 main sections;
 1. A viewing of the aviaries in the outside compound. Our permanent resident birds are housed here, including Woof Woof the talking Tui.

There may also be some “recovering” birds in these aviaries as well.
 2. A visit to the Education Room. There are displays of mounted birds to give visitors an idea of the range of birds that we get in at the Centre. There are also quite a number of photographs and stories about birds that have been at the Centre. It is during your visit to the Ed Room that one of the Centre staff will give a talk on what happens at the Centre in general and if you have notified us of any specific areas of interest that will be covered as well.
- If it is raining, the outside aviaries are NOT under cover so umbrellas and raincoats will be required. Or come and visit on an alternate day.

RAMS Information:

For visiting schools convenience, we provide the following RAMS information. These are the main issues; (this is not a conclusive list and it is recommended that Schools to do a pre visit to ensure all aspects are covered)

- Children must be supervised at all times.
- These are live, wild birds at our site, and they are NOT tame pets. DO NOT try to touch them or chase them into a confined area.
- Take care with the movement of vehicles in the car park area.
- Do not climb gates or fences. There is a very prickly cactus as well as 2 water pools in the fenced rock garden area in the outside compound.
- Where there are birds, there are bird droppings. There is hand sanitiser provided for public use at the entrance / exit of the outside bird aviary.
- Please enquire about where the emergency assembly point is on your arrival.
- There are no public toilet facilities at the Centre; toilets are available at the Museum.
